Prevent Frozen Pipes

Freezing temperatures put added stress on plumbing, especially pipes along exterior walls and outdoor spigots. **Your lease requires protecting the home's plumbing**, and a few simple steps can prevent costly damage during winter.

Inside the home, keep the heat set to **65°F or higher** at all times, even when you're away. On very cold nights, **open cabinet doors** under sinks so warm air can reach the pipes, and **allow faucets to drip** if temperatures are expected in the low 20s or below. If you notice *reduced water pressure or no water flow*, report it immediately—this can be an early sign of a freezing pipe.

Please **remove** and **drain** all **outdoor hoses right away.** Leaving a hose attached traps water in the line and can cause the pipe inside the wall to freeze and burst. After the hose is removed, the easiest way to protect the spigot is to **add a foam faucet cover** (<u>hardware</u> stores, <u>Amazon</u>, <u>Walmart</u>). If you choose not to use a cover, be sure the spigot is **properly insulated** so it's protected during freezing temperatures.

If you suspect a frozen pipe, **do not attempt to thaw it yourself**. Avoid heat guns, space heaters, or open flames near plumbing. Report any leaking or dripping immediately so we can address it safely.

Winter Weather Preparedness

Mid-Atlantic winters are usually mild, but sudden cold • snaps, icy conditions, and occasional snowstorms can cause problems. Here are some quick tips to stay safe and comfortable during winter weather:

- Keep Heat Steady: Maintain your thermostat at a consistent setting (65°F or higher). Sudden drops make frozen pipes more likely.
- Dress in Layers: Wear warm, moisture-wicking layers.
 Avoid cotton during icy/windy conditions; it traps moisture and makes you colder.
- **Use Caution Outdoors:** Ice can form even when temperatures hover just above freezing. Walk carefully and use handrails.

- **Be Ready for Power Outages:** Keep a flashlight, extra batteries, and fully charged phone. If you lose heat, keep interior doors closed to retain warmth.
- **Stay Informed:** Monitor weather alerts from local authorities for storm warnings, freezing rain advisories, or strong wind gusts.

Small steps make winter weather easier to manage. Stay warm; stay prepared

A Few Reminders to Keep Seasonal Stress at Bay

Maintenance Requests

Submit through portal, one item per request. If you mention something verbally or by text, follow up in the portal so it doesn't get missed.

Humidity Control

Cold weather can cause interior condensation. Use bathroom fans, kitchen vents, and keep blinds/curtains slightly cracked to allow airflow.

Fireplace & Candle Safety

Wood-burning fireplaces may not be used without express written permission. For safety, open flames (candles, incense, etc.) are also not permitted in the home. Use battery-powered alternatives to maintain a safe living environment.

Space Heaters

Space heaters aren't allowed due to fire risks. To stay warm: adjust your thermostat steadily, reverse ceiling fans to clockwise, use draft stoppers, and open curtains for daytime sun.

Smoke & CO Alarms

Winter = more heating devices, more risk. Take a moment to test all smoke and carbon-monoxide alarms to ensure they're working properly.

Frozen Pipes Prevention

Keep your heat set to at least **65°F**, even when you're away. Open cabinet doors on exterior walls, especially during freezing nights, and let faucets drip slightly if temps drop below 20°F.

Holiday Décor Safety

Use UL-listed lights, avoid overloading power strips, keep real trees well-watered, and unplug décor when not home.
